- Utilize our drive-up windows located at each of our branches.
- First Southern Bank Online and Mobile banking.
- Cash withdrawals at our ATMs. (As a reminder, if you have a Kasasa account, ATM fees incurred at an out-of-network ATM may be refunded up to a maximum of \$30 per month if all qualifications are met.)
- Deposits may be made at the Carbon Street ATM located at 801 N. Carbon, Marion, IL.
- Deposits can always be made at any of our facilities after hours night drops. (Reminder that deposits made in a night drop will be credited on the next business day.)
